KMC's New Studio – From Dream To Reality

Words cannot express the amount of gratitude, love and awe I have for my family and KMC family. This studio has always been my dream for my hometown of Rockport. I dreamt of a place for people who want to move, not just dance, but all forms of movement; a place to enjoy what makes them happy and healthy.

The First Step – Where To Build

My grandparents, George and Charlene Miller, moved to this property in the 1960's. I lived here, in this exact spot where their house was, until I was 7, playing in these very trees and this general area. The property was gifted to me in 2009 from my grandmother, mom and uncle; so that one day I could fulfill my dream of a studio for "movement". Without this first gift of love from my family, the next steps would not have been possible.

The Next Step – A 5-Year Process

During a quick conversation over 6 years ago with a parent of 2 of my students, my dream of a studio came up. I felt it was an almost impossible dream that would require far too much fundraising for me to do successfully by myself. Janie Johnnie promised she would assist and help me raise the funds. She was the catalyst that lit the fire under me to reach for my dream. With Janie's assistance and the help of many others, fundraising began which included haunted houses, a karaoke contests, a Bunco party, raffles, auctions, bake sales, car washes and garage sales. Slowly, we built enough funds for a down payment so I could start talking to banks. I went to 3 banks and the general response was - I don't make enough profit to take the gamble. That was when 1st Community sent me to apply at their Small Business Administration loan office. After another year of paperwork, I finally got approved for the loan. At the same time I started talking to banks, I started working on finding a contractor. After

-John F Kennedy trying to start dialogue with some local businesses and a wonderful concept drawn up by Joel Hearn to explain my vision, I was continuously shut down or never called back. Clint Madill was the first person that took me seriously and started the process of designing the building in close regards to the City of Rockport's many laws and permits. Hank Madill did all the legwork to provide me with the budget so I could keep talking to banks. I went big!!! Like 5600 square feet of **BIG!!!** So when I was able to present my "BIG" studio, the cost would be too much for the loan for which I had been approved. This meant new plans had to be drawn up to reflect the downsized square footage that would fall within my loan approval. Madill was already on to other projects and did not have time to rebid the building, so that's when I called Western Steel. The process with them was smooth and easy, due to the plans provided by Madill Designs. They were also an approved construction company with the Small Business Administration, which would have been another hoop for me to have to jump through, if the builder I ended up picking was not.

So during this year of applying and designing, we just kept fundraising. There were many obstacles; part of which was first just understanding what everything meant. I could see that some people didn't really think this would ever become a reality, and would smile and nod to say they "understood", but like everything, it's a process and mine was a slow one that took time to understand and do right. Finally, I am approved and plans are submitted and we're ready to go.

Another Year – Jumping Through Hoops

The next 8 months were spent getting approved for permits with the city. There were many challenges, both emotionally and financially, some involved the plans being "kicked back" for revisions the city deemed necessary. The first kickback needed some easy building fixes and a point system landscaping plan. Western Steel had to find a local plant company to create a plan, which meant more money. It took a few weeks before the plans could be resubmitted. Which triggered another "kick back" for an engineered drainage plan, which meant yet more money. So Western Steel used their engineer for the design plans with drainage, which took a month before we could resubmit the plans in May. The revised plans with drainage then had to be approved by 3 different offices in Rockport, and of course, by then it was

their vacation times. So that took almost 4 months for these 3 entities to review and pass the plans. On the lucky side, when I had the land surveyed, I also did the tree survey. Due to the location or state of the trees that needed to be removed, I didn't need to go to the Tree Committee. We were approved and Jeff Steckler came in to remove the trees.

I learned so much in this process. Mostly, I learned that the people who live here needed this place. Not just the kids, but people of all ages. I've had people say to me, "This is so good for you", but I didn't do this for me, I did it for "us"! All of "us" who **need** a place like this to find happiness in our souls on a daily basis. Thank you everyone for helping this to become a reality for us!

Many "KMC Angels" made this dream a reality, as each helped at exactly the time they were most needed, but more about that in February.
